OVERVIEW:

Greater Flint Health Coalition is seeking a part-time Registered Dietician to join our team in Flint, MI to work in a fast-paced, but rewarding collaborative environment. You will have the opportunity to use your skills and knowledge to provide professional nutrition counseling and education as it relates to positive health behaviors to community residents as well as Commit to Fit! and Genesee Children's Healthcare Access Program (CHAP) Clients.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Serve as a liaison for nutrition health services for CHAP Clients and Pediatric Practices.
- Evaluate the nutrition status of clients, considering dietary practices and deficiencies.
- Assess clients for food insecurities and provide them with appropriate, local resources if needed.
- Assist with the development of a health improvement, family based program for high-risk CHAP Clients (i.e. diabetic children).
- Provide community wide nutrition education, at the appropriate comprehension level, including (but not limited to): cooking demonstrations, label reading, shopping on a budget, and meal planning.
- Collect, analyze, and evaluate nutrition programming data to determine level of success. Maintain appropriate and timely documentation.
- Participate in health fairs, community meetings, and collaborative professional forums as needed.

- Registered Dietitian with a Bachelor's Degree in a health related field. 1-2 years' experience preferred.
- Experience delivering advice and disease-specific consultation on nutrition to diverse groups from various socio-economic backgrounds.

- Experience creating and managing work plans and time-sensitive deliverables and deadlines.
