Mini-Grant Request for Proposals (RFP) – 2022



FUNDING PERIOD: April 1, 2022 to September 30, 2022

APPLICATION OPENS: Friday, January 21, 2022

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Monday, February 14, 2022 at 1:00 p.m.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The Flint ReCAST (Resiliency in Communities after Stress and Trauma) Program aims to assist high-risk youth and families in the City of Flint. ReCAST seeks to promote resilience and equity through implementation of evidence-based violence prevention and community youth engagement programs, as well as linkages to trauma-informed behavioral health services. The goal of this program is for the greater Flint community to work together in ways that lead to improved behavioral and mental health, empowered community residents, reductions in trauma, and sustained community change. The 2022 Flint ReCAST Community Mini-Grant Program seeks to support youth serving community programs, empower residents, and build capacity to increase community-wide use of trauma-informed skills.

FOCUS POPULATION:

High risk youth and their families impacted by the Flint Water Crisis.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

The Flint ReCAST Program is dedicated to building a resilient community. Therefore, mini-grant awardee agencies will be mandated participants in (1) trauma informed skills training; (2) resilience training; and (3) mindfulness training.

SCOPE of WORK:

Flint ReCAST is seeking community-led mini-grant proposals that align with and advance the following ReCAST goals and objectives:

RFP Goal 1: Increase capacity and implementation of evidence- and community-based youth engagement programs through community partnerships to promote positive youth development

Successful grantees under this goal will provide community-based programming for Flint youth and families in the areas of health, career development, mental health promotion, peer support, and increased capacity and cross-agency collaboration of youth-serving programs. Applicants should seek to integrate or establish evidence-based trauma-informed and violence prevention approaches into new and existing youth programs.

How to Measure Your Impact and Reach Relative to Goal 1:

- Number of Flint youth engaged (by location, ward, zip code, and age)
- Demonstrated knowledge gain and skill achievement (pre and post survey evaluation or testimonials)
- Participation and retention rate
- Establishment of partnerships developed between community organizations to support expanded use of skills and training provided
- Documented outreach of shared positive messaging with other community residents and families

RFP Goal 2: Increase the capacity of trauma-informed practices and strengthen the integration of behavioral health services to improve equitable access

Successful grantees under this goal will provide family strengthening and evidence-based resiliency building training that leads to positive social, emotional, and behavioral health improvements. Activities might include trainings in trauma-informed approaches, mental health literacy training for parents and community service providers, self-care activity awareness, programming aimed at decreasing risk factors for ACEs

How to Measure Your Impact and Reach Relative to Goal 2:

- Number of working professionals, clinicians, parents, etc., who have been trained in trauma-informed approaches, resiliency, or mental health prevention
- Measure of knowledge gain (pre/post survey) of those provided education in trauma and resiliency
- Number of agencies or community organizations adopting trauma-informed policies or practices by type
- Reach of community engagement activities (by location, ward, zip code, and age)

SELECTION PROCESS:

In addition to a standard scoring review, Flint ReCAST is incorporating a robust community engagement process throughout the grant period to ensure projects are informed by community participatory budgeting and input. Therefore, all applications will be assessed by a ReCAST review committee for scoring and adherence to allowable program goals, and will be uploaded to www.flintrecast.org for the participatory budgeting process to take place through community voting. Part 2 of the attached application addresses this component of the selection process as it will be up to you as an applicant to “sell” your program to the community and seek support through votes on project merit and potential for community impact.

Flint ReCAST 2021 – Mini-Grant Application Guidelines

MINI-GRANT RANGE: \$5,000 – \$25,000

TOTAL AWARDS: Up to 12 grants will be awarded

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- Applicant organizations must be a legally incorporated entity in the State of Michigan with 501(c)(3) status or a project sponsored by a government agency or academic institution with a clear charitable purpose. Community-based organizations with a fiscal sponsor are also eligible to apply.
- Grant requests must have direct relevance to Flint youth and their families impacted by the Flint Water Crisis and relate to one of the two outlined ReCAST goals.
- Prior Flint ReCAST grantees are welcome and encouraged to apply.

THE FOLLOWING WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR FUNDING:

- Grants will not be made to organizations that discriminate based on ethnicity, race, age, gender identity, sexual orientation, religion, economic circumstance, physical/mental abilities and characteristics, or marital status.
- Grants for sectarian religious purposes or any religious activities are not eligible.
- Grants will not be made for loans, debt reduction, capital or building projects, lobbying, research, or annual appeals.

PROPOSAL RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Grant applications to support projects implementing evidenced-based strategies that emphasize one of the outlined ReCAST goals and objectives are strongly encouraged.
- Grant applicants should articulate measurable outcomes.
- Grant applicants should demonstrate collaboration with other local organizations. Letters of support are strongly encouraged but not required.
- Grant applications are encouraged to utilize, and reference community data resources focused on Flint children and families, including but not limited to the Flint and Genesee County Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA), the State of Flint Kids, and the Ruth Mott Foundation Community Dashboard.

APPLICATION PROCESS & DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR SUBMISSION:

All applicants must complete and submit all mini-grant application sections:

- Part 1: Applicant Organization Information Form
- Part 2: Project Description / Project Narrative
- Part 3: Proposed Outcomes and Reach
- Part 4: Budget Form / Budget Narrative
- *OPTIONAL* Part 5: Community Needs and Resources Assessment

A cover letter as well as letters of partnership are not required, but are encouraged.

All applications should be submitted via email to recast@flint.org no later than Monday, February 14, 2022 at 1:00 p.m. with the subject “**2022 ReCAST Mini-Grant Application**”.

Applications submitted after the deadline will **not** be considered.

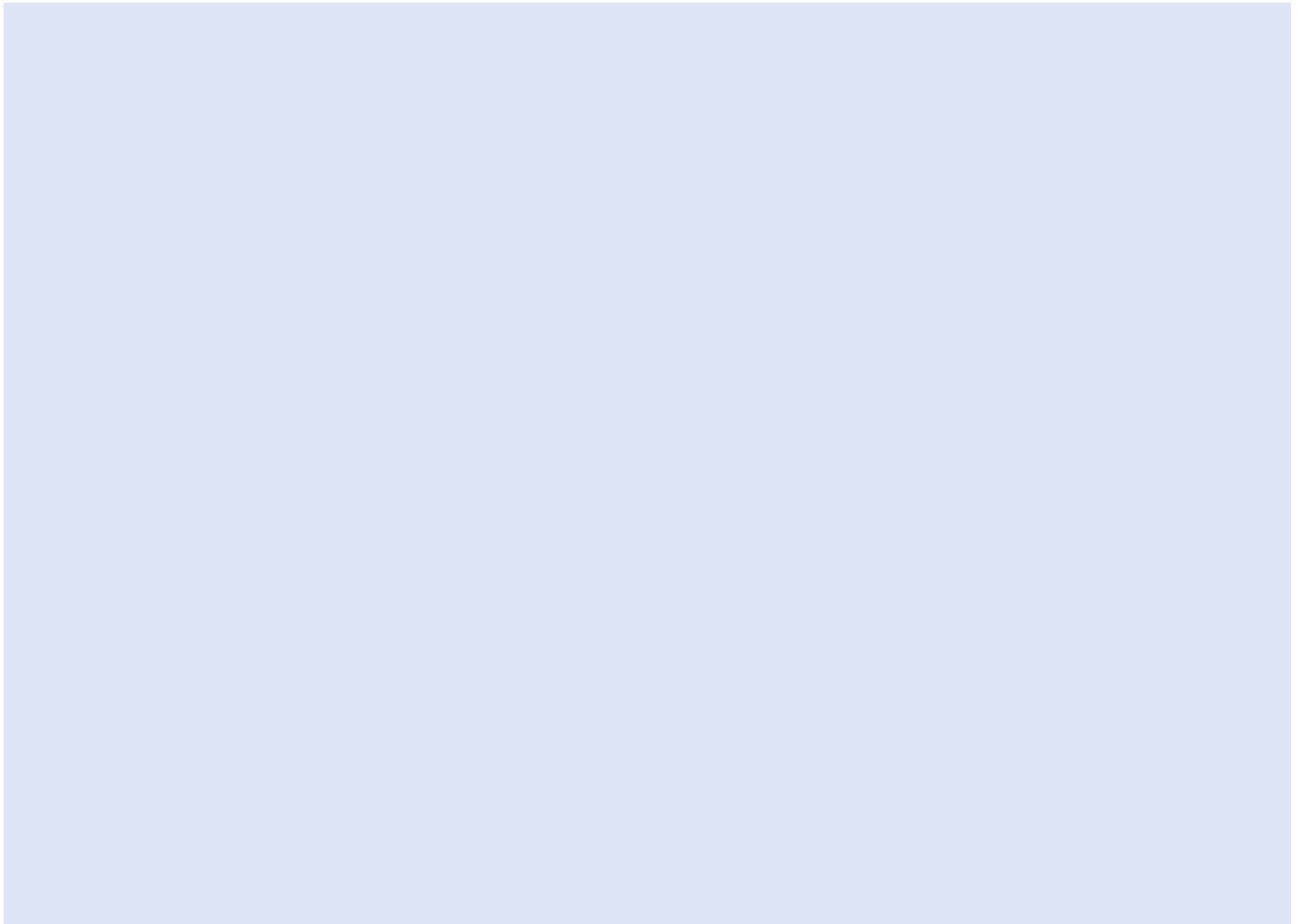
